□ SEVEN weeks after the death of Sir Henry Cecil, his legacy is flourishing. A painting of the peerless Frankel, the wonder-horse he trained, by artist Sophie Gilbert-Denham was being auctioned last night at Windsor racecourse. And the cause was a poignant one for Sir Henry. For the lot, which includes the buyer 'meeting' the stallion, will benefit the Brighter Future Fund, a charity founded by Henry's nephew Michael Cecil who lost his 15-month-old daughter Isla to a rare brain tumour just a month after she was diagnosed

in October last year. Yesterday property consultant Michael, 36, who has a four-month-old daughter, Rose, with his wife Anna, 35, completed a 15-day, 1,100-mile bicycle ride from Cornwall to Windermere to Southwold, finishing in Windsor. 'Isla was a gorgeous girl who died in my arms after we were told nothing could be done to save her,' says Old Etonian Michael, who will funnel funds into research at the Royal Marsden Hospital.
